A Way to Get Involved

What do organizations offer the NNC student? There is no single answer, but perhaps the best is that they are a way to become involved. Too often you hear complaints about the lack of things to do on campus. However, no matter what your interests may be, they probably can be developed within an organization on campus which, in the process, will make you feel a little more a part of NNC. If you are interested in government, there is everything from the student governing body itself to the dorm councils. If you are socially minded, there is the Social Work Club and CWB. But whatever your interest, they are all waiting, the publications, religious organizations, and special interest clubs, for you, the student, to join.





The ASNNC Executive Council, consisting of the ASNNC President, Executive Vice-President, Social Vice-President, Business Manager, and Secretary, is the head of the student activities and enacts all legislation given by the Senate.

The Senate represents the Student Body as a whole, with representatives from each class. It decides how ASNNC money is to be spent and how much student fees will be. Senate sets and appropriates money for student services such as the Bike Rental Program, the Book Exchange, and the airport taxi service. They also provide for the salaries and game supplies at the President's Home.

The Senate makes recommendations and all committees report to the Senate.

This year they appropriated money for the typesetter for the Crusader. bought a new piano for the President's Home, started Archives for the Senate for five years, and investigated the possibilities of Telo-lectures (lectures given over the phone).

General Missionary Society is the organization that deals exclusively with missionary work. Each year they have a main project, either on the Home Missions or the Foreign Missions field, that they raise the money for and then go and do. They raise the money by pledges from students, faculty, and other interested parties. After they have raised the money they need, they send a team to the place where their project is, in the summer, to use the money and their own time and labor, to complete that project. Beside their main project they also try to fit in small projects between terms.

This year GMS's project is to build a church in Bonál, Dominican Republic. Bonál is a city of ten_sto twenty thousand located sixty miles east of the capital, Santo Domingo. Sixteen people (shown at right) from NNC are to build a pumice block church in the three weeks they will be staying there. GMS, through pledges raised \$3,000 toward the \$10,000 it cost to build.
