## Meet Our Members by LaNell Stahl

Barbara Jones, a native Oklahoman, graduated from Capitol Hill High School in Oklahoma City and has a master in ministry degree from SNU, as well as having done post graduate work at Stony Brook University in New York. She and her husband Kenneth have two sons and one daughter, along with five amazing, genius grandchildren.

Barbara and Kenneth were global missionaries for the Church of the Nazarene, first in Peru and then in Paraguay as pioneer missionaries. After returning to the United States, they started the first Spanish speaking church in Brentwood, Long Island, New York.

"I have taught pre-school through university level, but my favorite job is teaching adult English language learners and ministerial training," stated Barbara. She currently works with the Bethany First Church - Southwest Native American District partnership as coordinator and instructor in their ministerial training program.

As an author, Barbara has written a missionary biography, *In the Footsteps of the Pioneers*, which is about Jane and Elvin Douglas, pioneer missionaries to the Aguaruna Indians in Peru. She co-authored an inspirational novel, *Anna's Song*, and has written and self-published several books for Spanish language teachers, primarily middle-school level.

Some of Barbara's favorite hobbies are gardening, reading and telling stories professionally, as well as just for fun. Currently she is vice-president of the Oklahoma state storytelling organization, Territory Tellers.

Kenneth was promoted to heaven August 3, 2021.

# **SNU Connections Howard Culbertson**

In this year's "SNU Connections" interviews at the monthly ASP meetings, we will hear from some key members of the university support staff. These are the people whose work that is often unheralded and even unnoticed allows this institution



to carry out its mission "to make Christlike disciples through higher education in Christ-centered community."

Our September interviewee will be Ron Lester, SNU's executive director of facilities management. Ron has been employed by SNU for 25 years. However, Ron Lester's relationship with Southern Nazarene University began even earlier than 1996 because, after he graduated from Yukon High School, he was on the SNU campus in 1978 and 1980 as a student. Upon leaving SNU, he launched into a career as a professional painter. He eventually wound up running his own painting business that worked on a lot of high-end residential and commercial properties. Then, fifteen years after leaving SNU, Ron Lester wound up back here at his alma mater to supervise the paint department.

Over the years, Ron's responsibilities have expanded and expanded. Today, he leads a facilities management staff of more than 50 people who maintain, upgrade, operate, renovate and provide security for more than 50 university buildings. In addition to the buildings – that contain a total of almost one million square feet in them – Ron and his staff care for the landscaping and grounds maintenance of the 240 acres owned or leased by SNU. This responsibility includes the school's athletic fields and the equestrian center west of campus.

ASP membership dues of \$20.00 should be paid at the September 13 luncheon. The monthly luncheon fee is \$6.00 which is subsidized by our sponsors.




# **Book Discussion** Barbara Culbertson


Although we are resuming in-person luncheons in September, book discussions this year will be held via Zoom at 1:30 on the first Monday of each month.
